

ONTARIO'S PLACE IN THE CANADIAN ECONOMY

Ontario is the economic engine that powers the Canadian economy. This one province contributes 41.88% of Canada's Gross Domestic Product (the total value of all goods and services produced in Canada). In addition, Ontario accounts for almost 60 per cent of all manufactured exports coming out of Canada, and accepts approximately 70% of Canada's total imports.

DID YOU KNOW THAT...

- Over 12 million people live in Ontario
- Ontario is the home of the nation's capital (Ottawa) as well as the home of one of the world's most culturally diverse cities (Toronto)
- Ontario currently leads North American automotive production. The province is home to 14 major assembly plants and over 400 auto parts manufacturers.
- Ontario has the 2nd highest GDP/capita in the country at (US) \$29,000.
- 135 million people (Canada and U.S.) live within a day's drive of southern Ontario with a personal income totaling US \$2.7 trillion.
- There are over 250,000 lakes in Ontario – they make up about one-third of the world's fresh water.
